China's aircraft carrier program is making major waves well before the first ship has been completed. Undoubtedly this development heralds a new era in Chinese national security policy. While the current volume presents substantial new insight on that particular question, its focus is decidedly broader in scope. Chinese Aerospace Power offers a comprehensive survey of Chinese aerospace developments, with a focus on areas of potential strategic significance previously unexplored in Western scholarship. The book also links these developments to the vast maritime battlespace of the Asia-Pacific region and highlights the consequent implications for the U.S. military, particularly the U.S. Navy.

ANDREW S. ERICKSON and **LYLE J. GOLDSTEIN** are associate professors in the U.S. Naval War College's Strategic Research Department and founding members of its Chinese Maritime Studies Institute. They co-edited several other books, including *China, the United States, and 21st Century Sea Power* and *China Goes to Sea*.
