

**Assistant/Associate/Full Professor (AD-1701-03/05/07)**  
**Cyber Operations and Security**  
**Strategic Research Department**

The United States Naval War College anticipates a full-time faculty opening in the Strategic Research Department (SRD) in Newport, RI, and invites applications for the position of Professor with rank and salary commensurate with experience and credentials.

The Naval War College is a graduate-level Professional Military Education institution serving the Nation, the Department of Defense and the U.S. Navy. The College is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, and offers a Master of Arts degree in National Security and Strategic Studies.

The Strategic Research Department produces a program of focused, forward-thinking, and timely research, analysis, and gaming that anticipates future operational and strategic challenges; develops and assesses strategic and operational concepts to overcome those challenges; assesses the risk associated with these concepts; and provides analytic products that inform the Navy's leadership and help shape key decisions. SRD thus produces innovative strategic research and analysis for the US Navy, Department of Defense, and the broader national security community.

The new hire will focus primarily on issues of cybersecurity, cyber war, and cyber conflict as they affect national security, strategy, operations, and tactics. He or she should focus either on the cyber capabilities of other nation states and transnational actors; or the ways and means by which the US (and, in particular, the US Navy) is developing the strategies, policies, capabilities, and organizations to defend the nation and project cyber power; or both. Candidates should possess the expertise, experience, and background in research methods to lead and coordinate faculty teams on issues relating to U.S. Navy (Fleet Cybercom) and U.S. Cyber Command equities within the broad issue area of cybersecurity and cyber operations. The best candidates will pursue a cyber-oriented research program at the intersection of theory and practice.

Qualified candidates should have a terminal degree from an accredited university; a research-oriented Ph.D. is preferred. Experience in evaluating strategic, operational and tactical concepts; as well as in-depth knowledge of relevant national and international cyber systems are all highly desirable. Candidates must be U.S. citizens and capable of obtaining a Department of Defense TOP SECRET/SCI security clearance.

The selected candidate will be subject to a pre-employment drug screening test and to random drug testing thereafter. Any current or prior military service should be described including assignments, positions held, highest rank attained and dates of service.
